- Coach and mentor staff to enhance primary-level palliative care competencies.
- Collaborate with community leaders on service integration and change management using QI methodologies.
- Consult on complex clinical cases beyond providers' expertise.
- Support Indigenous communities in palliative care implementation, as requested.
- Co-develop the regional Delivery Framework with Ontario Health, ensuring measurement and reporting.
- Promote regional collaboration and system integration.
- Align community implementation with Ontario Palliative Care Network guidance.
- Assess and improve palliative care quality in participating organizations.
- Lead palliative care quality improvement and practice change initiatives.
